The **Centre for Rural Health** in Inverness will host the kick off meeting for their [Northern Periphery Programme](#) (NPP) project 'Implementing Transnational Telemedicine Solutions'.

Project partners from Norway, Finland, Sweden, Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland will attend the meeting to be held at the [Centre for Health Science](#) building in Inverness on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> September. The main aim of the meeting will be to discuss current best practice in ehealth service provision and how best to implement these services across the project partnership area.

The project aim is to implement ten demonstrator projects on the themes of **video-consultation**, **mobile self-management** and **home-based health services** will be implemented in clinical specialities including speech therapy, renal services, psychiatry, emergency services, diabetes, inflammatory bowel disease, rehabilitation and care of the elderly. Common evaluation methods including health economics will quantify the outputs.

The **Centre for Rural Health** is an academic research centre which is a collaborative venture between the University of Aberdeen and the University of the Highlands & Islands.
