
The University of Aberdeen – History and Excellence

Founded in 1495, The University of Aberdeen is the UK's fifth oldest university and is one of the UK's most internationally distinguished universities.

In the most recent Research Assessment Exercise (RAE), 89% of Aberdeen's research activity was assessed to be of international quality and 55% world-leading or internationally excellent. Over the years, five Nobel prizes have been awarded for the work carried out or begun at Aberdeen. The University is at the forefront of many areas: arts and social science, computing, engineering, science and technology. Additionally, it is also breaking new ground in disciplines which focus firmly on the 21st Century.

The campus is crowned—literally—by a sixteenth-century tower in the shape of an imperial crown. Lightly travelled streets pass through the campus, and there are a number of green lawns and picturesque courtyards which are ideal for lounging on sunny days.

We have a long history of welcoming European students into our lively community and there are typically over 1,500 European students from all EU member states on campus. Once here you will be wholly integrated into Aberdeen student life, and will get to join the same classes, live in the same halls of residence (dorms) and have access to the same recreational facilities as other international and UK students. Studying at the University of Aberdeen will give you unrivalled advantages in terms of academic excellence, quality of teaching and research opportunities and, not least, an enriching student experience.


Scotland's business and education institutions are internationally recognised as world-leading in many areas.

Higher Education in Scotland

Education is one of Scotland's greatest talents. Every year Scotland welcomes international students from over 180 nationalities.

The Scottish higher education system boasts a strong tradition of academic excellence and has been used as a model for higher education systems throughout the world; the United States being one notable example.

Undergraduate Honours degrees in Scotland are usually four years in duration and are structured to ensure a great deal of flexibility during the first two years of study. Most students only confirm their major at the end of their second year. This means you can usually study any subjects that interest you, and even change direction as your interests develop! This differs from the English system, which is three years in duration, and is more specialised from the beginning.

Postgraduate degrees fall into two categories. Taught degrees generally comprise of tutorials and lectures before culminating in a period of individual study such as a dissertation or research project.

Often referred to as Masters degrees, they are known by various titles including Master of Science (MSc), Master of Letters (MLitt), Master of Research (MRes) and Master of Business Administration (MBA).

A Masters is likely to last 12 months (or more) full-time and may:

- involve a detailed study of a particular aspect of your academic discipline;
- be vocational and lead to exemptions and/or a professional qualification;
- be a conversion course developing your knowledge and skills in a new subject.

Research degrees involve the in-depth study of a specific field, normally over a period of two or three years. These degrees are supervised and lead to the awards of Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) or Master of Philosophy (MPhil).

The educational culture in Scotland is very much focused on independent learning and this is reflected in the number of contact hours students have with teaching staff. It is expected that a significant amount of study will be done outside of the classroom. Although the learning style is different, as well as the help provided in tutorials, you will also be able to see your tutor outside of these times by booking an appointment. Entry Requirements and How To Apply for Full Undergraduate Degrees

Undergraduate Study

The University of Aberdeen considers school leaving qualifications from throughout Europe.

All applications for undergraduate study in the UK should be made via UCAS (Universities and Colleges Admissions Service), a centralised application system, which allows you to apply to up to five different institutions/courses throughout the UK on a single online application form.

Postgraduate Study



ERASMUS Programme

ERASMUS is a European Union funded programme which aims to encourage and facilitate the exchange of students and staff in European universities. The University has over 250 ERASMUS links with over 180 universities in the following countries: Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Turkey. Switzerland is not part of the ERASMUS programme but the University has special exchange arrangements with some Swiss universities.

Subject areas with ERASMUS exchange links include: Anthropology, Biomedical Sciences, Celtic, Chemistry, Computing Science, Economics, Education, Engineering, English, Forestry, French, Geography, German, Hispanic Studies, History, Mathematical Sciences, Politics and International Relations, Psychology, Sociology and Zoology. International Exchange Programme

Students normally go on an exchange programme in their second year of undergraduate study. The year they spend abroad is an integral part of their Aberdeen degree and not an additional year. Credits gained are recognised by the University of Aberdeen and incorporated into the student's University of Aberdeen

List of Undergraduate Degree Programmes

The degrees awarded by the University of Aberdeen are recognised and respected worldwide. It's your degree and we believe it should be planned around you.

We admit you to a degree rather than to a subject, School or Department, so you can usually study any subjects which interest you, and even change direction as your interests and ambitions develop. A Scottish Honours degree normally takes four years to complete, so you can usually delay your final choice until the end of your second, or sometimes third year.

The MA and BSc degrees are especially flexible, and the LLB and BTh programmes also offer some flexibility. Other degrees like the MEng, the MB ChB or our Education degrees – which train you for a specific profession – offer less flexibility, as the content of these courses must satisfy the relevant professional organisation.

In many cases, two subjects can be studied at Honours level, leading to the award of either a Joint Honours or a Major-Minor Honours degree.

Industrial Placement

All students who are studying for a degree within the School of Medical Sciences (apart from Applied Sports Science - Education) are eligible to apply for a year's industrial placement. This gives the student an opportunity to spend the 4th year of their degree in paid employment and graduate after five years with an MSci (an undergraduate Masters Degree instead of a BSc). Academic Support

All undergraduate students will have their own personal Adviser of Studies. You will meet in your first week and they will help you to choose your subjects. They will monitor your academic progress throughout your degree and give you any advice as and when you need it.

All postgraduate students will work with their course co-ordinators and individual Schools to develop their academic programme of study.

Accommodation

Living in accommodation with other students can give you a great start at University. All single international students are guaranteed a room for the first year of study and all accommodation is either on or within close walking distance to the University campus.

All single EU students are guaranteed a room for your first year of study, provided you apply by the stated deadlines. We offer a mixture of catered and self-catered halls and there are a variety of options to choose from.

Hillhead Halls is the student "village" on the banks of the River Don, only 15 minutes walk or a short bus ride from the University campus. It is home to nearly 2,500 students and includes a number of traditional halls, self-catering flats and facilities for disabled students. Recently over 500 new ensuite rooms became available at Hillhead.

If you prefer private accommodation then you should arrive in Aberdeen in plenty of time before the start of the session to find accommodation. The Accommodation Office and Student's Association can assist with providing you with information on available accommodation in the city.

Wardens and Sub-Wardens

If you need information or advice when you're living in University accommodation, help is at hand from our trained wardens and sub-wardens. Their job is to ensure your wellbeing and to help you get the most out of communal life. Wardens are usually senior students or members of staff.

How Much Will University Cost?

Students from the EU studying in Scotland DO NOT HAVE TO PAY any tuition fees up front. The Student Awards

Undergraduate and Primary / Secondary PGDE Students:

Agency for Scotland (SAAS) will normally pay tuition fees for EU students (with the exception of students from England, Wales and Northern Ireland) studying at an institution in Scotland, up to a maximum of £1,820 for new students. The only exception is Medicine, where the fee is £2,895 per year. These fees do not have to be paid back. Fee payment by SAAS is not automatic and students must apply online annually at www.saas.gov.uk

Please note, certain courses do charge additional costs (e.g. for field trips) therefore you should refer directly to the relevant department website for further information.

Cost of Living

Students will require a minimum of £650 per month per person to cover additional costs.

Total Minimum Costs per Academic Year

Undergraduate Arts and Science students: staying for only 9 months in Aberdeen (approximately 38 weeks), SAAS will offer tuition assistance but students will need a minimum of £5,850 to cover living costs*.

Students who are studying a full-time course of any duration in Scotland (and their dependants) are eligible for free medical treatment under the National Health Service (NHS). You are advised to register with a local NHS medical practice as soon as possible after your arrival. Hospital treatments and visits to your medical practice are free of charge, however you will have to pay for any prescribed medication. You are advised to bring any relevant medical records and details of any existing medical conditions with you.

Working Part-time

EU students are normally permitted to work whilst studying in the UK. The University's Joblink service can help you find part time work as well as offer other employment advice. Please note that this must not be relied upon as a means to fund your studies.

Immigration Requirements/VISA

Please note that as an EU citizen you should not require entry clearance to the UK. However it is your responsibility to check any entry clearance (visa) requirements and apply for entry clearance (visa), if required. It is important to check all immigration requirements before travelling as those without the necessary entry clearance (visa) will be refused entry to the UK.
