Eibe Riedel is emeritus professor of German and Comparative Public Law, European and International Law at the University of Mannheim/Germany, and a former member of the UN Committee on Economic, Social and cultural rights, Geneva. He is a judge at the Hague Permanent Court of Arbitration, chairs the Board of Trustees of the German Institute of Human Rights, Berlin, and is a director of the Institute of Medical Law, Bioethics and Public Health of the universities of Mannheim and Heidelberg, as well as a director and founder of the Mannheim Institute of Transport Law, Inland Navigation Law. Prof. Riedel was Swiss Chair of Human Rights and is presently a visiting professor at the Geneva Academy of International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights. He also is honorary adjunct professor at the University of Adelaide. He chairs the Board of Trustees of the German Institute of Human Rights, Berlin.
