

- XI.—Whether the Claimant be a Minor,—or employed in collecting the Revenue, Stamps, Assessed Taxes, &c. or has received parochial relief.
- XII.—Whether, if the Claim is on a Lease, the premises be occupied *personally* by the person claiming.
- XIII.—Whether, if a double Claim be made upon a *Joint Lease*, there be actually *joint occupancy* by the Claimants.
- XIV.—Whether the Buildings or Land *claimed upon* are actually within the limits of the town's boundary—as fixed by the Reform Act.
- XV.—Whether, in the case of any of the Claimants, undue influence has been used to procure their votes—and specify particulars.
