

3.—The Committee had also before them plan of bungalow on the south side of Kincorth Road (beyond the City boundary), for Miss Jean A. Dickson, *per* Mr. Archibald Yell, Joiner. The Committee approved of the plan in so far as the Council are concerned.

4.—With reference to the Minutes of Council, of date the 1st current, the Burgh Surveyor submitted the tenders which he had procured for the extension of the sewer in Western Road, Woodside, and the Committee, having examined the same, resolved to recommend the acceptance of the offer of Mr. James Leith, Contractor, being the lowest, and amounting to £180 4s. 1d.—D. MILNE, C.

6.—The following Report by the Streets and Roads Committee was submitted and adopted, *viz.* :—

ABERDEEN, 4th March, 1926.—Report by the Streets and Roads Committee. *Present*: Councillor John Milne, *Convener*; Baillie Beaton; Treasurer Rust; Councillors Beveridge, Duncan, George, M'Rae, David Milne, and Willox.

The following Report by the Standing Sub-Committee was submitted, *viz.* :—

ABERDEEN, 26th February, 1926.—Report by the Standing Sub-Committee. *Present*: Councillor John Milne, *Convener*; the Lord Provost; Baillie Beaton; Treasurer Rust; Councillors Duncan, M'Rae, and Thom; also present Baillie Gray and Councillor Bowles.

1.—The Sub-Committee, at this and previous meetings, have had before them a letter from the National Union of General and Municipal Workers (Scottish District), with reference to four employees of the Streets and Roads department who were dismissed in March last and were re-engaged by the department on 25th June. The letter complained that the break in the men's services had caused them to lose the holidays to which they were entitled under the Council's resolution of date 4th August, 1924. The Committee had also before them a memorandum on the subject prepared by the City Chamberlain. The Burgh Surveyor, at the same time, reported that, in addition to the four employees mentioned in the letter, other two men in the department were in a similar position. He further reported that, in the case of five of the men, the matter had been remedied. The Sub-Committee instructed the Burgh Surveyor to deal with the remaining employee in the same manner as the other five had been dealt with.

2.—The Sub-Committee beg to recommend (Councillor M'Rae dissenting) that the following arrangement for widening Beechgrove Terrace on its north side opposite Fountainhall Road and at its junction with King's Gate should be entered into, *viz.* :—

80, Beechgrove Terrace—Miss Frances M. Tancred.

Miss Tancred to cede to the Council, for the purpose of being added to and widening the street, the piece of ground in front of the property No. 80, Beechgrove Terrace, measuring 53 square yards or thereby, and coloured red on the plan herewith submitted, upon the following conditions :—

(1) The Council to pay Miss Tancred the sum of £1 per square yard for the ground so to be ceded.

(2) The Council, at their own expense, to execute the following works, *viz.* :—(a) take down and re-erect where necessary the existing walls and railings; (b) add the strip to be ceded to the street; (c) lay and maintain an adamant foot-pavement with granite kerb along the ground to be ceded; (d) uplift and set back to the new line the existing hedge, and, if the hedge does not bear transplanting, a new hedge to be planted so as to form a screen between the property and the street; (e) execute any other work required in connection with the improvement.

(3) The cost of any conveyance of the ground which may be required to be borne by the Council.

82, Beechgrove Terrace—Dr. Bruce Wilson.

Dr. Wilson to cede to the Council, for the purpose of being added to and widening the street, the piece of ground in front of the property No. 82, Beechgrove Terrace, measuring 88 square yards or thereby, and coloured red on the plan herewith submitted, upon the following conditions :—
