

ON Thursday the 7th ult., a Meeting of the Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply for the County of Aberdeen, was held in the Court-house, for the purpose of taking into consideration the plan of Reform brought into Parliament by his Majesty's Ministers. Sir R. D. H. Elphinstone, Convener of the County, took the chair, when Colonel Fraser of Castlefraser, seconded by Charles Bannerman, Esq. of Crimonmogate, moved a series of resolutions, containing a declaration that the Reform Bill, especially as it regards Scotland, was unsuitable to the general interests of the country, and proposed changes which were altogether uncalled for. Sir Michael Bruce of Stenhouse, Bart., seconded by Sir John Forbes of Craigievar, Bart., moved an amendment, highly approving of the Bill. After a good deal of discussion, the roll was called, Resolutions or Amendment, when there appeared,—

For Sir M. Bruce's Amendment, 49
