- 10th November.—Portrait of ex-Lord Provost Esslemont, painted by Mr. George Reid, R.S.A., presented to the Council by the subscribers.
- 16th November.—Motion that the Council meetings be held at six o'clock in the evening negatived.

1886.

- 1st May.—The Moray Firth Coast Railway opened for traffic.
- 3rd May.—The Town Council resolve that the City Charters be printed.
- 31st May.—Old silver coins (about 12,267 in number) found underground in Upperkirkgate.
- 7th June—Authority given by the Privy Council for the formation of a Landing Place for Foreign Animals at Poera Quay.
- 29th October.—Motion that the Lord Provost and Magistrates be provided with official robes negatived.

1887.

- 10th February.—Removal of the "Old Oak Tree" from Regent Road, Inches, to the Duthie Park. [The tree was raised from the bed of the Upper Basin of the Harbour during dredging operations about the year 1832.]
- 7th March.—The Town Council subscribe £1,000 to the Jubilee Fund (£30,000) for the reconstruction and extension of the Royal Infirmary.
- 6th June.—The Town Council resolve to provide an official robe for the Lord Provost.
- 18th June.—Local celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee: Inauguration of the new Peal of Bells in St. Nicholas Tower.
- 27th June.—The Council's Address of Congratulation presented to Her Majesty at Windsor Castle, by the Lord Provost and the Town Clerk.
