Jack London and 216 Beach Walk, Waikiki: Film Screening and Director's Q&A

This work draws on extensive research in The Huntington's Jack London Papers and features images from its photographic series. The film seeks to problematize popular perceptions of Waikīkī as a symbolic paradisiacal site for touristic consumption. The title refers to the former address of a rented cottage that was home to Jack London, one of America's most prolific authors: "One day, this place is going to be one long hotel." Jack London's prophetic observation foretold the extraordinary urban transformation of Waikīkī, as exemplified by the abundance of high-rises such as Trump International Hotel, which occupies the site of London's former home.
