

## Financial Support for Students from England, Wales, Northern Ireland, The Isle of Man and The Channel Islands entering the University of Aberdeen in September 2025. (Updated January 2024)



<b>Annual Tuition Fees for September 2025 entry</b>	<p>The tuition fees for undergraduate students domiciled in England, Wales, Northern Ireland, The Isle of Man or The Channel Islands are £9,250 per year for those starting in September 2025.</p>
<b>Government Support (figures given for 2023)</b>	<p><b>England</b> (Student Finance England) <a href="http://www.gov.uk/student-finance">www.gov.uk/student-finance</a>          You can apply for a Tuition Fee Loan and Maintenance Loans for living costs while at university. Your tuition fee loan is paid directly to the university. The amount of maintenance loan you are eligible for is dependent on household income and personal circumstances. Please see the Student Finance webpage for full details.</p> <p>You begin repaying your loans once your income after graduating has reached the repayment threshold, currently £25,000 a year. You pay back 9% of your income that is over the threshold. If your income falls below the threshold, repayments will stop until your income pass the threshold once again.</p> <hr/> <p><b>Wales</b> (Student Finance Wales) <a href="http://www.studentfinancewales.co.uk">www.studentfinancewales.co.uk</a>          You can apply for a Tuition Fee Loan, Welsh Learning Grant and Maintenance Loan for assistance with costs while at university. Your tuition fee loan is paid directly to the university. The amount of Learning Grant and maintenance loan you are eligible for is dependent on household income and personal circumstances. Please see the Student Finance webpage for full details.</p> <p>You begin repaying your loans once your income after graduating has reached the repayment threshold, currently £27,295 a year. You pay back 9% of your income that is over the threshold. If your income falls below the threshold, repayments will stop until your income pass the threshold once again.</p> <hr/> <p><b>Northern Ireland</b> (Student Finance NI) <a href="http://www.studentfinancenl.co.uk">www.studentfinancenl.co.uk</a>          You can apply for a Tuition Fee Loan on its own or alongside any other available finance, including a Maintenance Loan, as part of your student finance application each year.          You can apply for a Maintenance <u>Loan</u> (based on your household income) of up to £6,776, which will need to be repaid. You can apply for a Maintenance <u>Grant</u> or partial grant depending on your household income. This can be as much as £3,475 and does not need to be repaid.          You begin to repay your loans when your income is above £22,015 per year. You pay back 9% of your income over the threshold.
