

13th International Gut Microbiology Symposium 2023

Case Study



The 13th Joint Symposium on Gut Microbiology, organized by the Rowett Institute at the University of Aberdeen and INRAE Clermont Auvergne Rhône Alpes Centre in Clermont Ferrand, France, took place in 2023 at the state-of-the-art P&J Live Conference Venue in Aberdeen, Scotland. The event featured a diverse program comprising invited talks, oral presentations, and poster sessions, showcasing the research of participants from around the world, including researchers, academics, and students.

Attendees enjoyed various evening activities, starting with a Civic Welcome Reception at the Aberdeen Town House, hosted by the Lord Provost, David Cameron, on the first evening. The second evening featured a 3-course dinner at Ardoe House Hotel. To conclude the festivities, participants experienced a Scottish Ceilidh at the Art Deco, Beach Ballroom, featuring the Ceilidh band Dark Island Trust. Profits from the band's performances, totalling over £100k over the years, are donated to local and national charities selected by the band members.

The conference was chosen by the Federation of European Microbiological Societies (FEMS) to provide grants for Early Career Scientists, awarding bursaries to 19 scientists to help cover their attendance and travel expenses.


