
# Is There An Optimal Structure For An Oil Producing Country With Respect To Imports and Exports: Case Study of Nigeria

- Comparative advantage of crude oil exports in Nigeria was analysed from 1994 -2013.





## Methodology


- Trade Openness indexes: Trade dependency index, import Penetration and Export Propensity index
- Trade Performance Indexes: Growth Rate of Exports and Export/Import Coverage
- Competitiveness Indexes: Balassa Index and Export Specialization Index.

#### Results

- Nigeria is relatively open to the trade of crude oil in Nigeria. Crude oil exports have been a significant contributor to the Nigerian GDP
- The contribution of crude oil to the Nigerian GDP is declining overtime. This can be linked to the decreasing growth rate of oil exports.
- Nigeria has comparative advantage in he exportation of crude oil to USA, India and the world.
