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NATURE OF THE PROBLEM

"Enclave" - The purchasing of materials and services are made from well-established suppliers from overseas.

- Exports significant quantities of oil drilled and imports skilled works from abroad
- Favouring tried and tested suppliers over local suppliers

Backwards & Forward Linkages

 Backward linkages – local employment, technology transfer, increase in local ownership

Rosebank Field - Backward Linkages

- 450 UK-based full-time equivalents over
- 1,200 FTE jobs at its peak in the third quarter of 2025
- Suppliers Involvement Day in Aberdeen
- Forward Linkages Refineries, production of fertilizer and petrochemicals

Forward Linkages - Refineries in Nigeria

■ 445,000 barrels of oil equivalent / day

LOCAL CONTENT POLICY INSTRUMENTS

Norway

- ❖ Joint Venture Agreement Norwegian Petroleum Directorate through the Joint venture instrument, selects who the operator should be
- ❖National Oil Company Statoil
- ❖ Technology Agreement 50% of research and development efforts relevant to field development take place in Norway

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

- ❖Jones Act -American built, at least 75% owned by United State citizens, and crewed by United States citizens
- Increased employment and national security
- ❖Increased cost cheaper alternatives in Singapore, Korea


UNITED KINGDOM

- ❖Offshore Supplies Office
- ❖Full & Fair Opportunity
- Memorandum of Understanding & Code of Practice -COP lists how prejudice is to be prevented, and the MOU outlines the goal of non-discrimination toward UK suppliers.

NIGERIA

- ❖Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development (Local Content Act) 2010
- 5% of managerial roles must be filled by foreign nationals
- 100% purchase of steel pipes, plates, pipeline systems, and risers must be made in Nigeria

DISCUSSIONS & CONCLUSION

- The higher or stricter the restrictive policy (local content policy) = higher the cost oil = decrease in profit oil = the small government share in profit oil
- Local-content policies need to look beyond simple generation of economic rents to focus on the development of linkages, thus backward, forward and demand linkages.
