ASSESSMENT

Caitlin checks in regularly to her Pathway to review her progress. By February she has collated 75 points – however, she decides she would like to attend further employer workshops on campus and she has seen an extra FutureLearn course that is of interest to her. This is no problem: she is not restricted to the number of activities she can undertake.

Because she has completed more than enough activities to give her 75 points, Caitlin decides to complete the reflective assessment by the March exit date (earlier than her target exit date) and has her Pathway to Success confirmed by 31 March.
