I have undertaken a range of placements in nursery and primary schools in Aberdeen and in rural settings. In final year, this culminates in an eleven week block with an upper primary class where I have a minimum of 15 continuous days' responsibility. The gradual increase of time in the classroom and level of responsibility throughout the degree have given me much greater confidence in my ability to communicate effectively with pupils, staff and parents.

I worked with the class teacher to promote effective learning by creating an atmosphere where pupils were encouraged to achieve. Duties included supporting literacy and numeracy, helping to prepare for lessons and classroom supervision.

I was employed for the academic year as a Personal Carer and Study Buddy to a disabled student at the University of Leeds. Duties included note taking at lectures, proof reading and scribing in exams as well as assistance with washing, dressing and feeding.

I worked on a shift rota including weekend sleepovers as a member of a small team caring for the needs of children with emotional, social and behavioural problems at a residential care home and respite centre. Duties included feeding, washing and entertaining the children and young adults. Developed counselling and negotiation skills and learned to be calm and patient under pressure.
