Welcome

to the 2009/10 concert season at the University of Aberdeen!

This year is one of the largest and most diverse programmes we have ever produced, with music to suit all tastes.

Kicking off the season is our ever-popular music student production. This year we are performing an abridged version of Carl Orff's 'Carmina Burana'. Also, we welcome back a host of favourite performers to our regular series of organ recitals and our old friends, The Edinburgh Quartet, continue their long and fruitful collaboration with us.

This year also sees a focus upon non-western music with a spectacular concert of Chinese Music (sponsored by the Confucius Institute for Scotland in partnership with Aberdeen Chinese Studies Group) and also Indian Music from Simon Thacker's fabulous, Nava Rasa Ensemble. Both of these were made possible by our continuing relationship with **sound** (North East Scotland's Contemporary Music Festival) as are other concerts, masterclasses and seminars presented on many aspects of contemporary music.

For the first time we link-up with the Spanish Consulate in Edinburgh to celebrate Spanish music and culture with a visit from two very distinguished musicians – Ara Malikian (violin) and Daniel de Pino (piano), and welcome back brilliant soprano, Irene Drummond in a celebration of the poetry of Burns in this, his 250th anniversary 'homecoming' year.

The Aberdeen Music Prize also enters its third year with a record number of entries. The BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra and eminent composer-judge, James MacMillan CBE will be sifting through the scores to decide who will

win the £5000 prize, which takes the form of a commission for the BBC SSO. This is not to be missed!

Our commitment to early music is marked this season with a visit from one of the greatest sopranos of her generation, Dame Emma Kirkby DBE. Dame Emma will present a wonderful concert of early song accompanied by the internationally renowned, Rose Consort of Viols at St Machar's Cathedral. If you love early music, then book your ticket quickly as her concerts are always sell-outs!

This season also sees the launch of our 'Fridays at 4:30' series – a new series of informal recitals for Organ and voices lasting around 30 minutes in King's College Chapel.

Add to these concerts from the University Orchestra, Choral Society and Concert Band (amongst many others) and you have a season of great music for everyone.

Our concerts would not be possible without the help of our sponsors and funders. In particular we are indebted to the Craig Group and Total E&P UK for their continuing generous support.






