

**Most recent visiting scholars  
at Aberdeen University Law School**

**Laura Carballo Piñeiro, Professor of Private International Law, Common Law Department, University of Santiago de Compostela, Spain** specializes in private international law, international litigation and international insolvency law. A Fellow of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation, her research has been published in a number of international journals in English, German, Italian and Spanish. She belongs to the research group *De Conflictu Legum*. Professor Carballo has been visiting fellow at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative and Private International Law, Columbia Law School and the Institute of European and Comparative Law at Oxford University, and she has taught in a number of institutions in Latin America such as the University of Antioquia in Colombia and the Central University of Venezuela. Professor Carballo is admitted to practice as a lawyer and has worked as a deputy judge in Spain. She has also been selected to serve as Director of Studies at The Hague Academy of International Law in 2017.

During her stay at the University of Aberdeen Law School in Autumn 2016, she researched on the private international law dimension of corporate governance, and in particular on the role of collective actions in providing corporate accountability. This is part of a bigger project focused on soft law and private international law. In addition to this and as a result of Brexit, she also undertook the examination of the referendum's likely consequences on the field of international insolvency. She presented her research to the Centre for Private International Law of the Law School.

**Jungnyum Lee** is a distinguished Law Professor at Soongsil University in Seoul, South Korea. Prof. Lee is an accomplished academic, researcher and lecturer, who has earned two doctoral degrees. She specializes in Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure Law, Criminology and Forensic Science (regarding methods of scientific investigation) and their respective Legislative Policies. Prof. Lee's research concerns in particular Comparative Criminal Law with an emphasis on the legal systems of Germany, the United Kingdom, the United States and South Korea. Currently, Prof. Lee is teaching courses in Criminal Law, Criminal Procedural Law, Criminology and Forensic Science to name a few.

Prof. Lee's most significant achievements consisted in the delivery of many manifold expert opinions on various issues of criminal legislative policy in South Korea. She has also published articles and books on matters such as forensic evidence (especially DNA evidence), hate crimes, crimes against children and women (sexual abuse, sexual assault, domestic violence), and crime prevention policies (preventive custody, electronic anklet) in Germany, the United Kingdom, the United States and South Korea.

Prof. Lee has been a member of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation of Germany since 2013 when she conducted research as a Humboldt research fellow at Georg-August-University Göttingen, in Germany. As a beneficiary of the Humboldt scholarship, Prof. Lee stayed at Aberdeen University Law School as a Visiting Scholar, from January to March 2015. She conducted comparative legal research on the Scottish, English and Korean criminal law systems concerning the obtainment, use and storage of personal biological information including DNA. One of Prof. Lee's most notable undertakings was a presentation on "Several Issues Relating to DNA-Information in the Criminal Justice System" in a Law School research seminar at Aberdeen University.

**Terence J. Centner** is a professor at the University of Georgia, Athens. He teaches four courses on agricultural and environmental law and wrote a textbook titled "Environmental Law and the Protection of People." His research programs involve the policy analysis of current issues confronting agriculture and the environment and include the application of findings to enhance economic performance. His policy analyses have been published in two books and more than 150 law review and scientific papers. Centner was chosen by the Alexander von Humboldt Stiftung as a research scholar at the University of Göttingen (Germany) and taught as a Fulbright Senior Scholar at the University of Mannheim (Germany). He served as president of the American Agricultural Law Association and has shared his research in 48 countries around the world.

As the 2014-2015 Fulbright-Scotland Visiting Professor at the University of Aberdeen, Professor Centner taught a course on "Environmental Concerns Relating to Energy Production." He was selected as guest editor for the Journal of Energy Research and Social Sciences and coordinated the selection and publication of 20 papers on "Observations on risks, the social sciences, and unconventional hydrocarbons." He also delivered a research seminar Managing Risks Related to Hydraulic Fracturing.
