A database within Web of Science, the Arts & Humanities Citation Index lists millions of journal articles. The **Find It** button searches for the full text or checks the catalogue for a print version where available.

Hundreds of top language & literature, history, art history, religion journals (not many current parts). Mostly full text but if not, click on the title of the article to find the **Find It** button.
