



# Torry systemic intervention

The Torry systemic intervention follows a staged, place-based approach, employing co-created demonstrators, which aim to surface possible leverage points in the system. Through participatory action research, stakeholder mapping and boundary critique, all informed by critical systems heuristics (questioning who decides the scope, who benefits, what facts matter, and whose values are being prioritised), a series of objectives and activities has been outlined at different scales and timeframes. These activities tap into existing projects, regulatory frameworks, opportunities, and structural constraints. The rationale and timeline for implementing them acknowledge the iterative process of linking theory and practice, the different scales and worldviews that intersect at the neighbourhood level and the long-term sustainability of the intervention. Thus, retrofit and the transition to a low-carbon built environment are emphasised incrementally at the whole-neighbourhood level, as opposed to fragmented, insular decarbonisation projects or top-down contested planning decisions.
