Psychology at the University of Aberdeen has a 130-year history and is part of one of the UK's oldest universities. The School of Psychology is recognised for its high-quality research and teaching, providing an excellent environment for postgraduate study.

Based at the historic King's College campus, the School offers modern facilities and close engagement with leading researchers through postgraduate taught and research programmes.

A supportive and diverse postgraduate community, combined with strong research training and professional development, prepares graduates for advanced careers in academia, healthcare, industry, and beyond.

What can I study?

Postgraduate Taught (On Campus Programmes)

MSc Psychology of Mental Health

The MSc Psychology of Mental Health provides an in-depth study of the psychological principles underlying mental health and wellbeing.

Students will be provided comprehensive training in mental health and illness, behavioural and clinical assessment, research methods, and professional skills. Both quantitative and qualitative research methods will be studied and students will explore a range of topics in psychological health and complete a thesis project.

The programme has established partnerships with key organisations including NHS Grampian and VSA, offering potential opportunities for practical experience.



MSc Psychological Studies

Our MSc Psychological Studies is a conversion programme designed for graduates from any discipline who wish to take the first step towards a career in psychology. It is accredited by the British Psychological Society.

The programme provides the core knowledge and skills needed for careers in psychology or related areas where a scientific understanding of human behaviour is valuable.

Students can tailor studies to interests and career goals through a range of elective courses, including options such as mental health and organisational psychology.

Completion of this programme can lead to further study in a range of applied psychology pathways, research experience such as an MRes or PhD, or careers in fields that benefit from psychological insight.

Postgraduate Research

The School of Psychology provides a highly collaborative research environment to deliver innovative research that can make a real difference to people's lives.

Our experimental research is organised around three research groups, each focusing on a different aspect of human behaviour: cognition, perception, and social cognition.

These all link to an applied psychology strand, focusing on the impact of our research on society, health, and industry. Across all these themes we support interdisciplinary research in an international context, linked to our relationships with local, national, and international stakeholders.

Central to all our research is open science and maintaining best practice in research integrity.

Research Study Options

MRes Psychology

The Masters of Research (MRes) course is a combination of taught modules and research project modules, lasting either one year (full time) or two years (part time). The taught courses develop core skills required for research, including reviewing literature, managing projects, preparing funding applications, disseminating your research through presentations and papers, and communicating with non-academic audiences.

You will attend lectures and participate in hands-on workshops, and complete a research project supervised one-on-one by an academic from the School. There will be training in IT skills, advanced statistics, and sessions on both quantitative and qualitative research design.

This training is taught using a combination of lectures and workshops, and uses frequent assessment and feedback to ensure you develop a deep understanding of the skills and knowledge needed for a successful research career.



PhD

The academic staff at the School conducts research in diverse areas of psychology, broadly organised around four research themes, Cognition, Perception and Attention, Social Cognition and Applied Research.

Students interested in pursuing projects in any of these areas are encouraged to contact the specific staff member for further details about the research topic.
