Men B	Protects against Meningococcal B bacteria that can cause: • Meningitis (infection of the lining of the brain and spinal cord) • Sepsis (severe blood poisoning)	2 Doses (Minimum 4 weeks apart)	Individuals born between 1 March 2008 and 28 February 2009 or were in S6 during the 2025/26 academic year regardless of future education plans. Individuals under 25 and starting an undergraduate course at university for the first time in academic year 2026/27. This includes international students. Individuals under 25 and starting college for the first time in academic year 2026-27, while living in shared student accommodation.
MMR	Measles, Mumps and Rubella.	2 Doses (Minimum 4 weeks apart)	No upper age limit. No previously recorded MMR or incomplete MMR vaccination history.
MenACWY	Infections caused by meningococcal bacteria groups A, C, W and Y.	1 Dose	Individuals with no history of MenACWY vaccination remain eligible until their 25th birthday.
HPV	Most common types of Human Papillomavirus that cause: • Cervical cancer • Cancers linked to HPV, including vulval, vaginal, anal, penile, and some throat (oropharyngeal) cancers • Genital warts	1 Dose	Females are eligible for HPV vaccination up until their 25th birthday. Because the HPV vaccination programme for boys began later in the UK, men are eligible up until their 25th birthday only if they were born on or after <i>1 Sept 2006</i>. Older men are not routinely eligible unless they are: • MSM (Men who have sex with men) aged up to 45 years • Transgender individuals attending sexual health or HIV clinic who are felt to have the same risk as MSM. • Sex Workers • Men & Women living with HIV infection.
