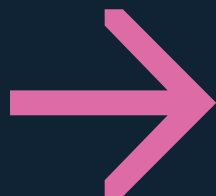

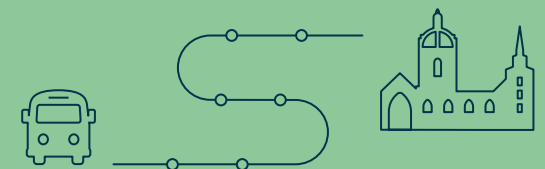

The Sir Duncan Rice Library - our award-winning multi-million pound library, home to arts, humanities, sciences, social sciences and the Special Collections Centre

Taylor Library - Law and official publications

Medical Library - Medicine



Key services and resources include:

- Over a million books, more than 800,000 e-books and over 28,000 e-journals - so you have access to resources on and off campus at a time to suit you
- The Special Collections Centre holds over 200,000 rare printed books and 4,000 archive collections in the Wolfson Reading Room
- The libraries are open daily, with hundreds of study spaces in silent, quiet and group study areas available at all sites across campus
- Desktop PCs located in libraries for research, study and email
- Laptop owners can connect to the wireless network whilst working in the libraries

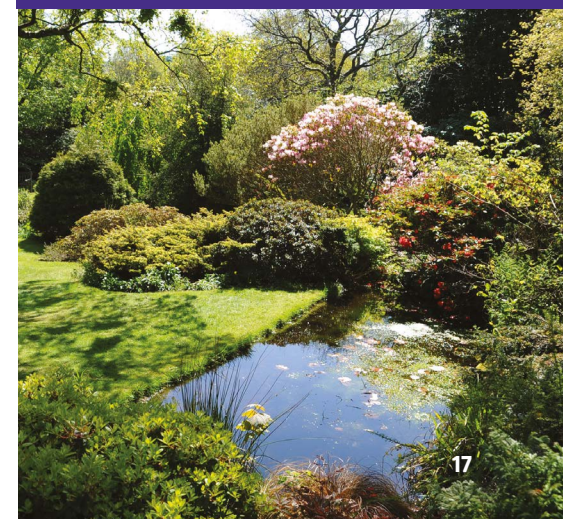

ASV has been used as a training ground for the Olympics and Commonwealth Games and hosts a number of athletic events.

Students with an ASV membership can access a range of activities, classes and facilities suitable for all levels of fitness and ability.

We also have an active Sports Union. Whether you're a beginner or competitive athlete, the opportunities to get involved are vast and varied.

ASV facilities include:

- Olympic standard 50m swimming pool
- 25m diving pool with floating floor and full diving facilities including springboards and platforms up to 10m

Medicine & Gateway to Medicine Programme

Activities will be taking place at the Suttie Centre (AB25 2ZD) for Medicine and Gateway to Medicine applicants at our Foresterhill campus between 09:20 and 14:15.

This is a full session event with multiple activities so please ensure you arrive at your group's stated arrival time, so you do not miss out on any sessions. You are then welcome to continue your day at King's College Campus.

There is no parking at Foresterhill on weekdays and limited parking on weekends so we would recommend taking public transport.

You will have been allocated a group when you registered.

Please arrive at your group's arrival time and check in at the registration desk once you arrive at the Suttie Centre.

All groups will take part in the following sessions:

- Medical Admissions
- Clinical Skills
- Anatomy
- Meet Staff and Students

All are welcome to attend the Medical Admissions lecture and Meet the Staff and Students session alongside your applicant and their group.

However, due to capacity, the Clinical Skills and Anatomy session will be for prospective applicants only.

The Parent/Guardian sessions will take place on the 4th floor at 10:15, 11:30 and 13:00.

We would recommend attending this while your applicant is at their clinical skills session. You are welcome to visit the stalls on the first floor at any point during the day.

Bus timetables to and from the Suttie Centre can be found on pages 28 and 29.

Buses will be leaving from Union Square in the morning to Foresterhill. Visitors should aim to use the buses as these align with session starting times.

There will also be some buses throughout the afternoon to King's College Campus.

Inter-campus shuttle (9U)

The 9U will also be running from Hillhead and King's College campus to Foresterhill throughout the day on weekdays.

Please note the 9U bus is a paid service; however, Scottish NEC cards can be used.

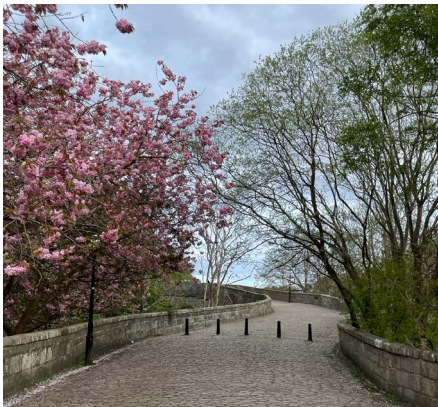

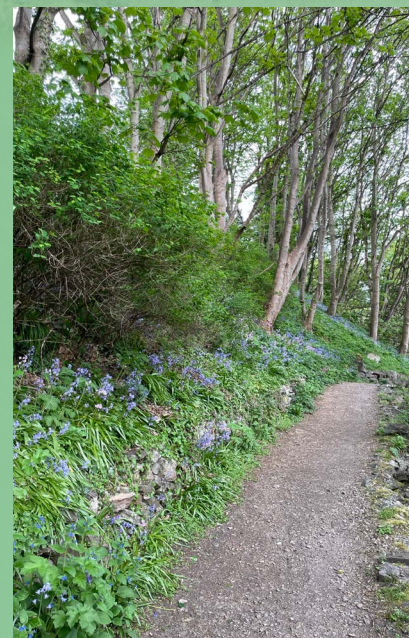




Make the most of your trip to Aberdeen!
