Students will meet with an Academic Advisor online, prior to registering for classes. Exchange Students must provide a minimum

Academic	Students will request an academic transcript to be mailed to their home institution

Housing and Meals	Exchange Students live in our on-campus Residence Halls in shared bedrooms. Shared bedrooms typically contain two students and may share bathrooms with multiple other bedrooms on the hall. Residence Life website. Meal plans are part of the housing bill charges.
