The University of Lausanne is a Swiss state university that focuses on Life Sciences, Geosciences, Environment, Business, Medicine, Humanities and Social Sciences. UNIL is a research-intensive university that encourages interdisciplinarity.

UNIL is situated at the heart of the French-speaking region of Switzerland, in the centre of Western Europe. It welcomes approximately 500 exchange students every year.

Restricted courses

Courses offered by the following units/programmes are not available to exchange students:

- School of Medicine (except for specific SEMP agreements)
- School of Criminal Justice (except for Master of Law in Criminology and Security)
- Master's programs in Biology
- MSc in Accounting, Control and Finance
- Executive programmes

Some practical assignments, seminars or lab courses may have limited places with priority given to degree-seeking students.

Study French

- Free full-time and part-time French language courses are available to exchange students during the academic semester.
- Fee-paying intensive courses in French are offered during the university holidays in July, August and February.

How to apply

Application

You must be nominated by your home university. Please contact the International Office of your university.

Requirements

- Level B2 in French and/or English depending on the courses chosen. Basic French skills are recommended for daily life and social integration.
- No minimum GPA is required.

Living in Lausanne

Housing

Studios and rooms in shared apartments are available in university residences in the city centre or on campus. The rent costs around CHF 700 to 900 per month depending on the type of accommodation and the location. Priority is given to incoming exchange students from overseas, then from Europe. Send your application by the deadline!

Private housing is also available, but it is currently difficult to find accommodation in Lausanne.

Cost of living

A budget of around CHF 2,100 per month is recommended to live in Lausanne:

- Food and living expenses: 850 to 900
- Accommodation (without utilities): 700 to 900
- Health and accident insurance: 150 to 300
- Books and course material: 100 to 150

Working in Switzerland

Students with a B or L permit, holding a valid residence permit, and enrolled with UNIL can work part-time during term time and full-time during the holidays. Please note that non-EU citizens must wait 6 months from their arrival in Switzerland before getting a job.
