- 7th September.—The Outer Marches perambulated by the Town Council and Citizens.
- 8th October.—Foundation Stone of the New Market Buildings laid by the Lord Provost.
- 19th November.—Opening of the Female Orphan Asylum in Albyn Place. Erected and endowed by Mrs. Elmslie, of Woodcote Place, Epsom.

## 1841.

- 11th January.—The Council sanction the introduction of gas-light into St. Clement's Parish Church. [One of the brass chandeliers which formerly hung in the East Church was, at the same time, fitted up with scroll branches, and otherwise adapted for gas-light, and presented to St. Clement's Church by Provost Blaikie. It now forms the centre gasalier.]
- 28th June.—Foundation Stone of the widening of the Bridge of Dee laid by the Lord Provost.
- 6th October.—Foundation Stone of the Asylum for the Blind, Huntly Street, laid by the Lord Provost.
- 29th October.—New Public Schools in Little Belmont Street formally opened,
- 24th November.—Grand banquet and display of fireworks in honour of the birth of the Prince of Wales.

## 1842.

- 2nd February.—The Cross and plainstones ordered to be removed to their present site at the east end of Castle Street.
- 28th March.—Motion for the admission of the public to the meetings of Council defeated by 12 to 6.
- 29th April.—New Market Buildings publicly opened by a musical promenade and concert.
- 14th May.—Keystone of the last arch in the widening of Bridge of Dee driven by the Lord Provost.
