- 6th April.—The Council consider it inexpedient to change the hour of the Council Meetings to the evening.
- 7th May.—Public Meeting of Householders in regard to the adoption of the Public Libraries Acts.—134 voted in favour of the adoption of the Acts and 488 against.
- 30th October.—Portrait of ex-Lord Provost Anderson, painted by Mr. George Reid, R.S.A., presented to the Town Council by the subscribers.
- During the year the Council had under consideration various comprehensive schemes for the utilization of the Town's sewage.

## 1873.

- 3rd March.—The Town Council remit to a Committee to report on the subject of widening Union Bridge.
- 29th March,—First Election of the Aberdeen School Board.
- 7th April.—The Council petition Parliament in favour of a Bill to remove the electoral disabilities of Women. [The same course was followed each year thereafter up to and including 1879.]
- 5th May.—The Council (by a majority) petition against a Bill to enable Burghs in Scotland, of 25,000 inhabitants and upwards, to appoint Stipendiary Magistrates.
- 11th June.—The Lord Provost and Town Clerk authorised to proceed to London to present the Council's Address to the Shah of Persia.
- 1st August.—Art Exhibition in the Town and County Hall opened.
- 29th December.—Local celebration of the marriage of H.R.H. the Duke of Edinburgh.

## 1874.

- 15th May.—The money terms in Aberdeen were this year changed from 20th June and 20th December to 15th May and 11th November respectively.
- 31st August.—Inauguration of the Tramway System in Aberdeen.
- 4th September.—The Channel Fleet visited Aberdeen Bay, and vessels were opened for inspection by public.
