1888.

- January.—The statue of Her Majesty The Queen removed, for preservation, from the corner of St. Nicholas Street to the vestibule of the Town House.
- 5th March.—The Council recommend the first Monday in May and the second Monday in September as Spring and Autumn holidays respectively, in place of the Sacramental Fast-days, to be discontinued. [The proposed change was first observed on the first Monday of May following.]
- 19th March.—The Council resolve to present an Address to their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, on the occasion of the celebration of their Silver Wedding.
- 4th June.—Arrangement made by the Council for the minimising of labour at the Corporation Gas Works on Sundays.
- 16th June.—Statue of the late General C. G. Gordon, in front of the Art Gallery and Gray's School of Art, unveiled by the Marquis of Huntly. [Sculptor—T. Stuart Burnett, A.R.S.A.]
- 29th June.—Statue of Sir William Wallace, at Rosemount Viaduct, unveiled by the Right Hon. the Marquis of Lorne. [Sculptor—W. Grant Stevenson, A.R.S.A.]
- 24th July.—Royal Assent given to the Aberdeen District Tramways Act, 1888.
- 1st October.—The Council remit to a Committee to report as to the advisability of widening Union Bridge.
