2.	Candidates who have not passed PS 4019 but have enough other elements in the Grade Spectrum for the award of an Honours degree shall be awarded the non-accredited Behavioural Studies degree with French.
3.	Honours programme may only be taken by full-time study.
4.	Designated Programme: See Supplementary Regulation 1 Levels 1 and 2 as for Honours programme Level 3 – PS 3011, PS 3014, PS 3520, PS 3518, PS 3519
5.	Language competency levels are listed as a guide, courses may vary based on ability and are subject to diagnostic testing.
6.	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including those compulsory courses required to enter programme year 3.
