It is possible for a student to graduate with the degree of Bachelor of Medical Science (10A10198) instead of the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery once 360 or more Credit Points have been achieved. This would normally occur after successful completion of ME4805 SSC 3 Clinical Effectiveness in the third term of Year 3.
3.	It is possible for a student to graduate with the degree of Bachelor of Medical Science (Hons) (10A10170) instead of the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery once 480 or more Credit Points have been achieved, including a minimum of 120 at level 1 (Cert) (7), 140 at level 2 (Dip) (8), 110 at level 3 (Ord) (9) and 110 at level 4 (10).
