| i | Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3. |
| ii | Students are required to have exactly 240 credits at levels 3 and 4, at least 210 of which must be AC, EC, FI, IB or MS coded, and. At least 90 credits must be at level 4. |
| iii | MBus students take year 4 abroad (work placement or study through medium of chosen language or English if no language options taken. |
| iv | The Accountancy specialism is NOT accredited by the accountancy professional bodies. |
| v | Students need to follow a specialism through years 1 and 2 to ensure that they have sufficient prerequisites to follow courses in years 3 and 5 (with or without a specialism at that stage). |
