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**Notes**

i	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
ii	Students are required to have exactly 240 credits at levels 3 and 4, at least 210 of which must be AC, EC, FI, IB or MS coded, and at least 90 credits must be at level 4.
iii	MBus students take year 4 abroad (work placement or study through medium of chosen language or English if no language options taken).
iv	The Accountancy specialism is NOT accredited by the accountancy professional bodies.
v	Students need to follow a specialism through years 1 and 2 to ensure that they have sufficient prerequisites to follow courses in years 3 and 4 (with or without a specialism at that stage).
