

RURAL SURVEYING AND RURAL PROPERTY MANAGEMENT (MLE/PgDip LE)

Aim: Fast track conversion programme(s) for graduates seeking entry to the chartered surveying profession. The Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS) accredits both the Postgraduate Diploma (PgDip) and the Master (MLE). The purpose of the programme(s) is to prepare candidates for entry to the Rural or the Environmental Faculty of RICS.

Duration: 12 months full time (MLE, 180 credits); 12 months full time (PgDip, 120 credits); 9 months full time (PgCert, 60 credits, no Dissertation or Diploma Case Study). 24 months part time (MLE, 60 credits + 120 credits).

For MLE:

PART TIME ROUTE

For part time route, choose two courses out of the four available at each stage. Dissertation will be chosen during the second year.

Assessment: By course work, by written examination, or by a combination of these, as prescribed for each course.
