2	Students are required to have exactly 240 credits at levels 3 and 4, at least 210 of which must be AC, EC, FI, IB or MS coded, and. At least 90 credits must be at level 4.
3	MBus students take year 4 abroad (work placement or study through medium of chosen language or English if no language options taken.
4	The Accountancy specialism is NOT accredited by the accountancy professional bodies.
5	Students need to follow a specialism through years 1 and 2 to ensure that they have sufficient prerequisites to follow courses in years 3 and 4 (with or without a specialism at that stage).
6	A minimum of 360 credit points including at least 90 credit points of Level 3 courses in AC, EC, FI, IB or MS coded courses and the prescribed IN coded courses listed for programme years 1, 2 and 3.
