2.	<p><u>Designated Degree</u></p> <p>A minimum of 360 credit points including at least 90 credit points of Level 3 courses in Geography and the prescribed courses listed for programme years 1, and 2.</p> <p>Level 3 – 30 credit points of GG 30XX Approaches courses (GG 3031, <u>OR</u> GG 3071 and GG 3068, <u>OR</u> GG 3071 and GG 3069) <u>PLUS</u> an additional 60 credit points from level 3 courses in Geography.</p>
3.	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
4.	<p>Acceptable Geography courses for Programme Years 3 and 4 are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • any Level 3 or 4 GG-coded course • any Level 3 or 4 MR-coded course • SX 3505
5.	Students are advised to take at least one of GG 3570 or GG 3575 in Programme Year 3.
6.	Students wanting to do one of the Honours field courses (GG 4573 or GG 4574) must register for these in Programme Year 3. This may entail registering for an extra 15 credits during PY3, but with 15 credits less in PY4. Note that the trips run in the summer vacation.
