3.	The 5 credit point course LS 2531 may be taken in addition to the Legal Studies requirements in programme year 2. If this course is chosen the credit load for the year will be 125 credit points, of which 65 credits will be from Legal Studies courses.		
4.	The Psychology Joint Honours degree is accredited by the British Psychological Society for graduate membership provided graduates have passed all the prescribed Level 3 and 4 courses
