2.	Students must take their dissertation in Economics.
3.	Students who are completing their studies out of sync and wish to do their dissertation in Economics will be required to take their dissertation in their final half session (first half session coded course EC 4026) with the permission of the Head of Discipline.
4.	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
