*Duration*: 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MLitt); 9 months full-time or 21 months part-time (PGDip); 4 months full time or 8 months part time (PgCert).

Content: Candidates must undertake the following curriculum:

### **FULL TIME ROUTE**

# Stage 1

Normally, students will take 60 credits in Stage 1. The following courses are mandatory:

AT5044 Museum Practice (15 credit points)

AT5043 Researching Museum Collections (15 credit points)

In addition, students will normally take a further 30 credit points from the following electives (some courses may not be available in every year, others may be made available):

ED503E Developing a Theory of Practice: Learning and Museums (30 credit points)

AT5050 Museums and the Digital World (30 credit points)

# Stage 2

Normally, students will take 60 credits in Stage 2. The following courses are mandatory:

AT5526 The Museum Idea (30 credit points)

AT5555 Navigating the Museum Workplace: Career Portfolio Project (30 credit points)

# Stage 3

Normally, students will take 60 credits in Stage 3 from the following electives (some courses may not be available in every year, others may be made available):

AT5912 Curating an Exhibition (60 credit points)

AT5908 Museum Studies Dissertation (60 credit points)

Candidates who elect not to proceed via the project to an MLitt shall be awarded a Postgraduate Diploma if they have achieved a total of 120 credit points, made up of 90 credits from the four mandatory courses, plus a further 30 credits from approved elective courses.

Assessment: By a combination of coursework, written and oral examinations as prescribed for each course, the degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS mark of D3 or above in the Museum Studies Project irrespective of their marks in other courses.

# **PART TIME ROUTE**

This route will run over two years. Students can take up to 120 credit points in a single year. The following courses are compulsory:

AT5043 Researching Museum Collections (15 credit points)

AT5044 Museum Practice (15 credit points)

AT5526 The Museum Idea (30 credit points)

AT5911 Navigating the Museum Workplace: Career Portfolio Project (30 credit points)

Plus at least 30 credits from:

ED503E Developing a Theory of Practice: Learning and Museums (30 credit points)

OR

AT5050 Museums and the Digital World (30 credit points)

Plus 60 credits from the following (some courses may not be available in every year, others may be made available):

AT5912 Curating an Exhibition (60 credit points)

AT5908 Museum Studies Dissertation (60 credit points)

Assessment: By a combination of coursework, written and oral examinations as prescribed for each course, The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS mark of D3 or above in the Museum Studies Project irrespective of their marks in other courses.
