Duration: 26 months part-time (MSc); 19 months part-time (PgDip); 7 months part-time (PgCert).

<u>Health Economics for Health Professionals</u> is a part-time on-line study programme. It is based on a series of discrete courses of 15 credits each. Compulsory and elective courses are offered at each stage (semester). The specific number and combination of courses a student would take at each stage depends on the level of degree being pursued. Students must take at least four of the five taught health economics subjects (PU5008, PU5401, PU5501, PU5542 and PU5533).

- MSc students require 180 credits, (8x15 taught credits + 60 credit project, minimum of two years)
- PG Diploma students require 120 credits (8x15 taught credits, minimum of one year and seven months)
- PG Certificate students require 60 credits (4x15 taught credits, minimum of seven months).
