

UKRI Open Access Policy Changes

This guide illustrates changes present in the new UKRI Open Access Policy in comparison to the previous policy. These changes apply to research articles and conference proceedings with an ISSN submitted for publication from **1st April 2022**.

New UKRI Policy from 1st April 2022	Previous UKRI Open Access Policy
Articles must be published with open access immediately when published via the institutional repository. This must be under the CC BY license or other open licenses permitted by the UKRI (United Kingdom Research & Innovation).	Articles were allowed to have an embargo period : 6-24 months before the manuscript was made open in AURA but could be deposited.
Check with openaccess@abdn.ac.uk where an article processing charge (APC) is required to ensure funds are available. Also check open access publisher agreements .	Check with openaccess@abdn.ac.uk where an APC is required and for advice on open access agreements.
Notify the publisher of the intention to apply the CC BY licence to any accepted manuscript at submission. If publishing open access through a repository, include the rights retention statement*.	No requirements to notify the publisher of the intention to apply the CC BY licence to any accepted manuscript at submission.
Include a data access statement in your published article even if no data is available.	No requirement for open licenses on accepted manuscripts.
When the article is ready for publication, send confirmation of acceptance and the accepted manuscript to paperaccepted@abdn.ac.uk for upload to Pure/AURA.	When the article is ready for publication, send confirmation of acceptance and the accepted manuscript to paperaccepted@abdn.ac.uk for upload to Pure/AURA.
