#### APPENDIX TO MINUTE 301

#### RESOLUTION NO 228 OF 2002

#### [DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF MUSIC (B MUS)]

After consultation with the Senatus Academicus, the University Court, at its meeting on 25 June 2002 passed the following Resolution:

1. On the recommendation of the Senatus Academicus, the Degree of Bachelor of Music (B Mus), abolished by University Court Resolution No 153 of 1992, is hereby re-established and assigned to the Area of Study 'Education'.

2. The supplementary Regulations following are hereby approved in place of those previously in force.
3. The last intake to the Music programme for the Degree of Bachelor of Education (B Ed) took place in September 2001. Students admitted on or before that date and who remain in continuous attendance will be permitted to complete their studies for the degree in accordance with the Regulations in force at the time of their admission, but if they have not done so by 30 September 2006 shall be held to have abandoned their candidature for the degree. Alternatively students may, after application to the Undergraduate Programme Committee (Education), be permitted to transfer to the Degree of Bachelor of Music (B Mus), subject to such conditions as the Undergraduate Programme Committee (Education) may prescribe.
4. This Resolution shall come into force on the day on which it is passed by the University Court.

#### REGULATIONS

1. The Degree of Bachelor of Music (B Mus) may be conferred in one of two forms: either as the Designated Degree of B Mus or as the Degree of B Mus with Honours. Candidates for the Degree with Honours who have completed satisfactorily a programme accredited by the General Teaching Council for Scotland shall be awarded the Degree of B Mus with Honours (Education). The degree shall not be awarded *honoris causa tantum*.
2. Every candidate, before being admitted to the degree, must attend for interview and practical examination.
3. Candidates for the Designated Degree of B Mus must achieve a total of 360 credit points; candidates for the Degree of B Mus with Honours must achieve a total of 480 credit points.
4. The courses qualifying for the degree are those detailed in the Schedule of Courses which is annexed to these Regulations. Students must comply with the requirements of that Schedule.
5. Candidates shall only be admitted to an Honours programme for the Degree with the approval of the Head of the Department of Curriculum Studies and only if they have previously obtained 240 credit points. Students who have been admitted to an Honours programme may register for additional courses only with the consent of the Head of the Department.
6. Students will be admitted to the Honours (Education) programme only after interview. At this point, and subsequently, they must meet the requirements of the General Teaching Council for Scotland.
7. Notwithstanding the definition of 'credit' contained in Regulation 1, candidates on the Honours (Education) programme must satisfactorily complete all prescribed degree assessments in order to be awarded the degree. However, with the exception of School Experience, only the first attempt at any assessment may be counted towards Honours degree assessment.
8. The Senatus Academicus, on the recommendation of the Undergraduate Programme Committee (Education), may require candidates on the Honours (Education) programme to discontinue attendance on courses in the programme if they fail any period of school experience on a second occasion.
9. Any health, conduct, behaviour or other issue that could bear on a candidate on the Honours (Education) programme's suitability or fitness for teaching will be investigated by the UPC(Education) Fitness to Practise Committee. The Senatus Academicus, having considered the recommendation of the UPC (Education) Students' Progress Committee, may suspend or terminate the studies of candidates for the degree of B Mus with Honours (Education) who, following a proper process of investigation, are judged not "fit to practise".
