Our exciting range of courses are sure to heighten your curiosity, broaden your horizons and develop your ability to reason.

Aberdeen is a great place to study the Arts. Our courses open up the rich history of cultural traditions from across Europe and the world, and offer you the opportunity to explore the links between them. Many also draw on the wealth of materials which are held in the University's museums, libraries and special collections reflecting the heritage of an institution educating students since 1495.

You can combine our subjects with many others, including business, law, history, sociology and philosophy. Our Sustained Study language courses allow you to learn a new language or improve your command of an existing one alongside your main subjects of study. We offer Arabic, French, Gaelic, German, Mandarin, Spanish and Swedish. If you are studying our Modern languages and Translation & Interpreting degree, or one of our joint honours degrees in French, German or Spanish, you will have the opportunity to spend time abroad, studying, teaching or working. Our degrees offer great flexibility, the opportunity to pursue a host of placement and study options, and routes into careers at home and abroad, from international business to arts management and the third sector.

- Aberdeen is one of the few universities in the UK where your studies can take you from Viking literature to Andalusian Flamenco.
- Our Music department covers a wide range of music, from renaissance to rock, and from opera to electroacoustic music, while offering you the chance to perform in a wide range of ensembles, including early music, choirs, orchestras and jazz.

Undergraduate degree

In the School we offer twelve subjects at undergraduate degree level. If you are still deciding which direction you would like to take in your studies, our programmes are designed to be flexible so that you can easily transfer from one programme to another. Our programmes allow you to take courses from other disciplines in the University, so you can combine many arts and humanities degrees with business, law, and other subject areas.

MA Celtic & Anglo-Saxon Studies

One of the few such degrees in the UK, our exciting programme explores the literature, history, languages and culture of the Celts, Vikings and Anglo-Saxons. Working with international experts, you will discover how the UK, Ireland and Scandinavia have been shaped by Celtic history and culture. Many of our students combine the programme with archaeology, and go on to have careers in heritage management, teaching, research and broadcasting.

MA English

English, in its many forms, has been used down through the centuries, becoming an integral part of our lives today. Immerse yourself in works of literary art from Shakespeare and the Renaissance right through to Victorian literature, Modernism and contemporary Scottish and Irish writing. Studying MA English opens the door to many career pathways, including publishing, journalism, broadcasting and education. You can also study **English with Creative Writing** with our team of authors and poets including some of Scotland's best-loved writers. The degree can be combined with another humanities subject on offer at the University of Aberdeen.

MA Film & Visual Culture

With our innovative programme, you explore not just the history and theory of film from Hollywood to the New Wave, but the whole array of visual culture that surrounds us, including selfies and medical imaging. Our practice-based courses help you develop your own skills as a filmmaker and you can enjoy a range of public events, exhibitions and film screenings. Careers include broadcasting, new media and journalism.

MA French & Francophone Studies

French has been taught at Aberdeen since the 1890s, and the Carnegie Chair of French was established in 1926. Our programme explores the history and diversity of French and Francophone culture, taking you from the Early Modern to the contemporary period and across the French-speaking world. Courses range widely across film, literature, linguistics, sociology, politics and history. Your time abroad can be in Paris, Lyon, Brussels, Geneva, and even the island of La Réunion in the Indian Ocean. Our graduates go on to a range of careers, including international relations, management consultancy, teaching and translation.

MA Gaelic Studies

Gaelic has been taught at Aberdeen for over 100 years. You will learn about Scotland's oldest living language, and be immersed in its rich literary and cultural traditions. Opportunities for graduates are very good: teaching, Gaelic development, arts management and librarianship are all career options and there is an increasing demand for Gaelic graduates to work in the media. The Gaelic Society organises ceilidhs and trips, and offers the opportunity to use Gaelic in informal settings.

MA German Studies

Like French and Gaelic, German has been taught at Aberdeen for over a century. The teaching team includes native speakers from Germany and Austria. Courses cover the literature, film, art and history of the German-speaking countries. Options for your time abroad include studying in German-speaking universities or working as a language assistant. German can be combined with our other Modern Languages as well as a wide range of other humanities subjects.

MA Modern Languages and Translation & Interpreting Studies

This programme aims to transform strong linguists into highly employable translators and interpreters. You will develop a high level of proficiency in up to two languages, reinforced by practical experience of employment during a period of residence abroad. You will explore the use of specialised language in a range of contexts (business, legal, technical, scientific, literary) and learn how to apply it in specific translation and interpreting settings.

MA English Language & Literature

Study the development of the English language from its Anglo-Saxon origins to contemporary usage while exploring its rich literary history. You will explore the language of Old English, the structure and use of contemporary English, and the rich variety of literature in English that has arisen alongside its linguistic development. MA Language and Linguistics

You will join one of the country's top Linguistics departments, ranked first in the UK* by the National Student Survey 2023.

*The ranking is an aggregated mean average of positive responses percentage across 25 questions that are asked at all institutions across the University. The ranking is based on the Guardian University Guide 2023 edition list of universities.

The programme will develop your understanding of key topics from phonetics and syntax to sociolinguistics and language acquisition. Linguistics graduates are highly employable, with openings in communications technology, language teaching, broadcasting and publishing.

MA Spanish and Latin American Studies

Aberdeen is one of the most dynamic places to study the Spanish language and Latin American culture in the UK. The wideranging and interdisciplinary programme explores visual culture, literature, history, politics, citizenship, society and anthropology across Spain and Latin America. Many of our students study Spanish & Latin American Studies alongside subjects such as Politics & International Relations, Sociology and Anthropology. Your time abroad can take you to a host of countries including Peru, Mexico and Chile.

BMus Music

Our Music degree gives you the opportunity to learn, compose and perform with worldrenowned composers, musicologists, performers and practitioners across many genres, styles and periods of music. At Aberdeen, traditional and contemporary influences combine naturally. As well as developing your existing talents, you will be able to explore new avenues such as community music, electroacoustic composition, and ethnomusicology.

You can perform in the beautiful King's College chapel and you will benefit from private instrumental and vocal lessons. Our graduates have gone on to be professional performers, composers, teachers, researchers, and entrepreneurs in the arts and creative industries.

BMus Music Education

Music Education at Aberdeen is unique in offering the integrated study of music and education within an academic University music department. The programme embraces a flexible approach fostering innovation, creativity, social interaction and collaboration whilst developing your knowledge and skills and their application in an educational environment. The programme includes supported school placements, and you will graduate with a qualification to teach in Scottish secondary schools, inspiring a new generation of musicians.

Professional & Cultural links

Our research and professional networks are integral to our work and benefit our students in several ways.


