How to apply

Step 1. Apply online using the “International Exchange” student application for Admission : <http://www.ubishops.ca/future-current-students/bishops-university-online-application/>

Step 2. All exchange students must upload the required supporting documents to their online BU application, or scan them to admissions@ubishops.ca

- Copy of the ID page of your valid passport
- Official transcript from home university
- Letter of recommendation from home university
- Proof of English language fluency to study at an English language university, (either a test score, IELTS 6.5, TOEFL 90), or a letter from your home university attesting to your equivalent level of proficiency in written and spoken English, if you are not attending a university where English is the language of instruction.

Step 3. For exchange students staying for 2 semesters or more, must upload the required supporting documents to their online BU application, or scan them to admissions@ubishops.ca

- Copy of CAQ (Certificat d'Acceptance du Quebec)
- Copy of Study Permit

Nominations

Nomination processes are sent in the month of August for the next Fall and Winter semester.



Admission Deadlines

September 15: Online application for September 2020 semester opens

May 1: College and University Transfer Admissions Application deadline (September 2019)

May 15: Preliminary document deadline for all applicants

June 1: Deadline to accept Fall offer of admission

June 15: Residence application deadline

August 1: Official final document deadline

October 1: Winter (January) admission application deadline for exchange students

December 1: Winter (January) acceptance of admission offer deadline

Residence move in day is TBC

Orientation week is from TBC

Classes begin on September TBC and Examinations end on December TBC. October 12, Thanksgiving Day in Canada, is the only holiday in the Fall semester. The examination schedule will be available in the Fall.

Winter 2020 classes begin on January 8 and examinations end on April 26. March Reading Week/Spring Break is the week of March 2-6, 2020 (no classes).

Admission Requirements: General

- Strong academic standing at your home university
- Support of your home university for your proposed exchange

Admission Requirements: Program-Specific

Proposed exchange program must correspond closely with the field of study followed at your home university.
