Tuition fees

- Tuition fees for those spending one or two semesters abroad are usually paid to the University of Aberdeen as normal, though the exact method of payment will depend on your fee status (see table below). No tuition fees would be due to your host university for those on study exchange.
- Exact tuition fee arrangements will depend on when students commenced their degree.



Turing Scheme

- Global destinations
- Minimum duration one month; maximum duration 12 months (funding year runs September to August)
- However, funding for 2024/25 is likely to be limited, with the following groups being prioritised:
 - Compulsory mobility (Languages/5-year LLB)
 - Widening access students
