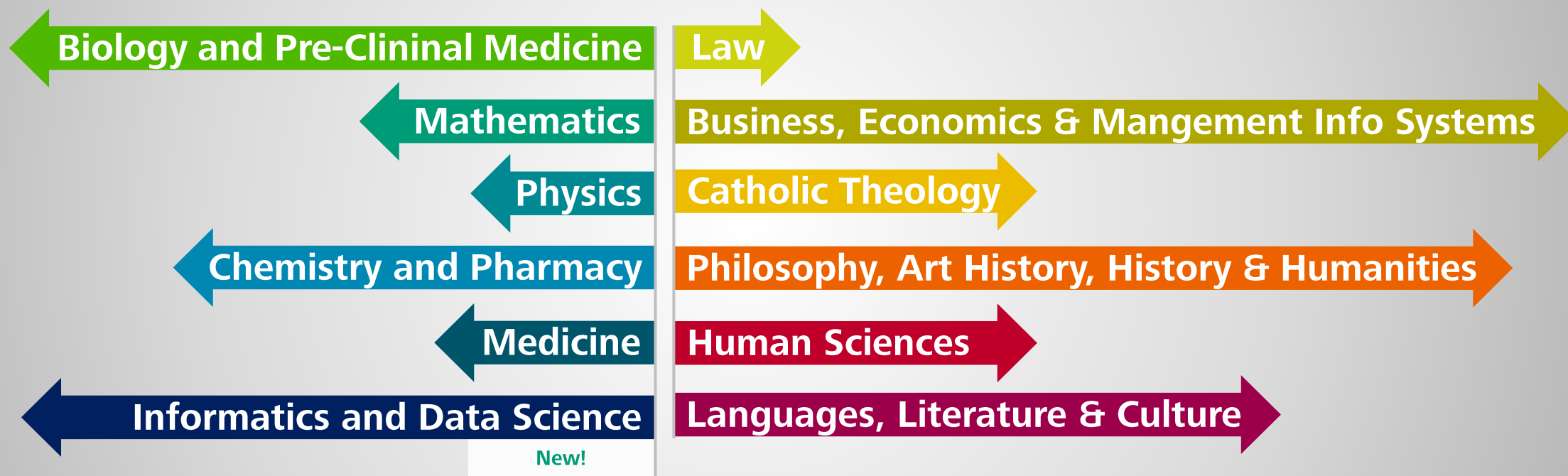


The University UR

- In most cases you are free to choose from courses throughout the different faculties, and from different study programs.
- There are some exceptions like medicine, pharmacy, fine arts etc.

Academic Calendar - Winter Semester

- arrival: ILC participants start of September; all others start of October
- ILC: ca. September – first week of October
- lecture period: mid-October to mid-February
- exams: usually last week of lecture period and week after lecture period
- students of business and economics might have exams also in March
- departure: ca. end of February

Academic Calendar - Summer Semester

- arrival: ILC participants start of March; all others start of April
- ILC: ca. March – first week of April
- lecture period: mid-April to mid-July
- exams: usually last week of lecture period and week after lecture period
- departure: ca. end of July

**German language
requirements?**

Courses in English

Learning German

Pre-semester intensive language course (ILC)

- 120 hrs of learning German, 12 ECTS
- includes orientation and events with student tutors
- suitable for absolute beginners who want to learn enough German to „survive“ a German environment,
- but also students who want to improve/reactivate their German.
- fee: 380 EUR for ERASMUS students, 360 for other exchange students

We have courses in English...

approx. 400 courses taught in English, mainly in the following departments:

- Languages, Literatures, Culture and Media Studies
- Humanities, History and Political Science
- Business and Economics
- Psychology and Education
- Biology, Chemistry, Computational Science, Mathematics and Physics

Where will you live?

In one of our student residences

- 99% of all exchange students live in student dorms
- residences are not located on campus, but throughout town
- there are buses connecting all dorms with campus
- single rooms, with shared bathroom and kitchen
- Germans and internationals, undergrads and postgrads all live together



**Is Regensburg
expensive?**

Decide for yourself

Fees for exchange students:

- you should expect to spend about 950 Euro per month for living
- semester fee: ca. 180€ (this includes a bus ticket valid in Regensburg)
- residences: reservation fee 150€, rent between 250 and 450€/month, deposit: 350€ (refundable)
- TV tax: 18 €/month
- health insurance: ca. 130€/month (If you have an EHIC, this does not apply to you)
- residence permit: 100€ (for non-EU nationals)

1kg potatoes	€ 0.50
1kg apples	€ 2.50
0.5kg spaghetti	€ 1.00

1 coffee at a café	€ 3.70
1 sandwich	€ 3.75
1 meal at „Mensa“	€ 4-5

tickets (student rate)

cinema	€ 7 -12
theatre	€ 8 -30
museum	€ 2 -15

average: 950€ / month

How do you apply for Regensburg?

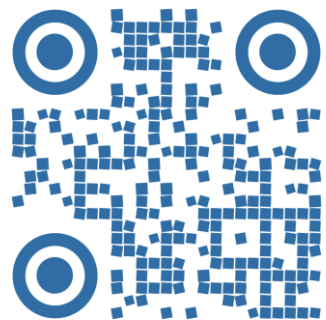
These are the steps

- Contact your local study abroad office.
- Once your home university selects you, they will nominate you as an exchange student to UR.
- After we have received your nomination, you will receive information on handing in your application.
- As soon as your application has been processed, you will receive a letter of admission and an information package.
