## **Proposal Revision Exercise**

Finally, during year 1, students will complete a proposal revision exercise, which will not bear any course credit. This will be a supervised process of enhancing their PhD proposal in light of greater familiarity with primary evidence and secondary literature and enhanced research and writing skills.

# Progression to Years 2-4

To progress beyond year 1, students must achieve the following:

Coursework Average: 16 on CGS (by June)
 Proposal Revision Exercise: Pass (by June)

• Dissertation Mark: 17 on CGS (by August)

• Letters of Recommendation: From supervisor and 1 course instructor (by August)

#### **Alternative Year 1 Exit Routes**

If a student does not achieve the progression standards for entering years 2–4, or if a student discontinues the programme, the following alternative exit routes are available.

PGCert: requires successful completion of 60 credits of coursework
 PGDip: requires successful completion of 120 credits of coursework
 MTh: requires successful completion of 120 credits of course and the

dissertation (60 credits)

### YEARS 2-4 (FTE)

#### Overview

Years 2–4 of the Integrated PhD proceed just as would the standard PhD in Divinity, including supervised independent research, the requirement to successfully complete progression exercises (PGR1 by end of year 2, and PGR2 by end of year 3), submission of a written 100k-word thesis, and *viva voce* defense of the thesis.

# Alternative Years 2-4 Exit Routes

If a student discontinues the programme either because of withdrawal or unsuccessful progression, one of the following exit routes may be taken:

MTh by Research requires successful completion and defense of a 40k-word thesis
 MPhil: requires successful completion and defense of a 70k-word thesis
