

MEDIEVAL AND EARLY MODERN STUDIES (MLitt/PgDip/PgCert)

Duration: 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MLitt); 9 months full-time or 21 months part-time (PgDip).

Students take 105 credits from the following options, but courses in other disciplines at level 5 are also open and should be agreed with the programme co-ordinators.

- HI503A Directed Reading in History (30 credit points) , may be taken in lieu of HI502K with the agreement of the programme coordinator
- HI552G Independent Reading in Historical Studies (15 credit points)
- HI502T Engaging with Historiography (30 credit points)
- HI552R Presenting Historical Research (30 credit points)
- HI502J Old Norse 1: Language, Literature and Culture (30 credit points)
- HI552M Old Norse 2: Language, Individuals and Society (30 credit points)
- BU5068 Business for Arts (15 credit points)

Note:

Students with appropriate proficiency in Latin or students intending to do a dissertation on a topic not requiring Latin may take alternative non-Latin courses from the list of electives, in consultation with the programme coordinator. Please note that LT1009 must be taken with LT5001.

Postgraduate Diploma (Total credits: 120)

In addition to the 105 credit points above students take HI5913 Research Paper or HI552G Independent Reading in Historical Studies (15 credits).

Master's Stage (Total credits: 180)

In addition to the 105 credit points above students take HI5915 Dissertation in Historical Studies (75 credit points)

Assessment: Normally by a variety of forms of continuous assessment. The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve CGS grade of D3 or above in the Dissertation, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
