1.	The Psychology Honours degree is accredited by the British Psychological Society for graduate membership provided graduates have passed all the level 3 courses and the level 4 thesis, PS 4019, and obtain an overall degree at 2:2 (Lower Second Class Honours) or above. Honours students will be debarred from continuing into level 4 by the Head of School unless they sat the degree examinations at the first opportunity (certified illness excepted) and passed all the level 3 courses either at the first opportunity or at the resit diet of examinations in the same academic year.
2.	The Honours programme may only be taken by full-time study.
3.	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including all prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
