### **PART TIME ROUTE**

This route will run over two years. Students can take up to 120 credit points in a single year. PI5907 must be taken in Year 2. The following courses are compulsory and can be taken in either Year 1 or Year 2:

The degree of MSc shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS Grade of D3 in the relevant dissertation course, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
