Duration: Part-time study only - 12 months (PgCert); 24 months (PgDip); 36 months (MSc)

Content: The MSc in Clinical Education aims to develop and build on students' existing knowledge and skill in teaching and learning and introducing them to relevant current theories and evidence that underpin this practise. By the end of the course, students will have a thorough grounding in all the main aspects of medical education i.e. delivery as well as the organisation and leadership of medical education.

Taught courses provide skills which are then applied in the independent research review and empirical research projects
