Duration: 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MRes); 9 months full-time or 18 months part-time (PgDip); 4 months full-time or 8 months part-time (PgCert).

Overview: This programme provides advanced training in social research methods. It equips students with the skills and practical experience needed to conduct independent social research. The programme addresses a broad range of research methodologies, but also enable students to develop intellectual and practice skills related to their own area of social research. For students wishing to undertake a PhD in Politics, International Relations or Sociology, the programme provides the support and training needed to complete the first stages of doctoral research.

Content: Candidates shall be required to attend a programme of courses in general social science and subject specific areas:

PART TIME ROUTE

Year 1

This route will run over two years. Students can take up to 120 credit points in a single year. PI5904 OR SO5909 must be taken in Year 2. The following courses are compulsory and can be taken in either Year 1 or Year 2:
