Students will take a total of 180 credits over two years.

Year 1

Assessment: By a combination of coursework, written and oral examinations where appropriate for each course. The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS Grade of D3 or above in EL 5904, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
